Atlantans Shine in NAP

Atlanta was well represented in the North American Pairs finals at the Spring NABC last month in New Orleans. Olin Hubert competed in the Open flight. Flight B included Linda Bush and Peter Martin, with that latter placing 18th overall. Libba Wight and Carolyn Luesing participated in Flight C, as did Candace and Richard Brown who finished tenth.

The top Atlanta performance went to two of our talented youth players, Richard and Andrew Jeng. The brothers won Flight B with an incredible finish, jumping from 13th place after the third round to win the event with a 61.5% final round. Their 794.99 matchpoints over four rounds of play provided a mere .06 margin of victory. This is the second national title for the Jengs; they previously won the 0-1500 Life Master Pairs in 2011.

In September of last year, Tom Carmichael accomplished something that very few ACBL members will ever do. He has won over 10,000 master points. In addition, since winning the National IMP Pairs in 1997, he has attained the rank of Grand Life

Master. There are over 168,000 ACBL members, only 319 have attained the rank of Grand Life Master.

Tom is a frequent volunteer in the bridge world. He chairs the National Competition and Conventions Committee. He has coached many of the junior teams and was the Captain of the USA 2 Team at the World Championships in China last summer. Tom also teaches bridge classes at the Bridge Club of Atlanta.

Tom and his wife, Director Jenni Carmichael, have represented District 7 in both the GNT and NAP Competitions.

2015 Mentor Program

In January, 2015, the DBAA sponsored a Mentor Program with the generous underwriting support of Unit 114.



In seven Atlanta bridge clubs there are a total of 148 unique mentor events with 70 Mentors and 70 Non Life Masters (NLM) participating. Of the

148 free plays that were awarded to Mentors, 131 were redeemed before the March 31st deadline. In comparison, six clubs participated in 2014 with 165 unique events, 100 Mentors and 74 NLMs. The reduced count might be attributed to the short lead-time provided to the clubs because of the January time frame.

We'll likely move the program later in the year for 2016, perhaps as late as May. Another possibility would be to sponsor a Friendship Game at each club in 2016. Typically a Friendship Game would have every pair, playing in that event, consist of one Life Master/Mentor and one NLM. Club Owners, Managers and Directors will be surveyed for their opinions and preferences for future events. Likewise, participants are always invited to provide feedback. If you wanted to participate but didn't for any reason, it is especially important that we hear from you.

Many thanks to those that gave generously of their time to provide a meaningful playing and learning experience for a NLM to improve.

Newsletter Editor





Lead: 🌲 4

North shows a big hand -19-21 points - and South has extras, enough to check on key cards. She bids slam after partner shows two key cards and the ΔQ . If you didn't pursue slam with such fine shape and ten points including two aces, your bidding is too conservative.

Declarer has no losers in hearts or spades and can trump the fourth club. Her only problem is how to play the spade suit. Should she finesse the queen? Or the ten? What would you advise her to do?

You shouldn't answer my questions until you ask, "What is the form of scoring?" I'd tell you that this is a team event so this is IMPs.

If Declarer finesses, she goes down. The key is to take the A first – a safety play – planning to lead later towards the Q. The opening lead should make you wary of a ruff. In addition, playing teams, you only need to take 12 tricks. If the K is on side, it will


still be there the second time you lead the suit. And if it is offside, ...

Let's say you finesse and lose to the card above it. When you lead spades the second time, you'll have to guess whether to finesse again or play for the drop. Playing the ace first eliminates any need to guess.

Yes, South was unlucky to find an offside $\bigstar K$ and a 6-1 club break. But proper technique often can overcome bad luck.

You'd have a tougher call in matchpoints. If the ♠K is doubleton on your left, you can make 13 tricks. I'd still take the safety play, assuming that many pairs won't get to the 29-point slam. But I might be wrong. In IMPs, however, the playing the ace first is clear-cut.

Here's the full hand.



Note: I played this hand in a Regional Swiss Teams event. I took the finesse and went down 1 on the club ruff. The opponents bid and made 5. That's a 26 IMP swing for my failure to take the safety play.

I haven't made that mistake since.
