

Local organizers and ACBL officials have taken great pains to ensure this event will be fun and exciting for players at every strata.

level. Newer players can choose from 0-5, 0-20, 49ers, 99ers, 199ers, 299ers. There are Gold Rush pairs every day. Look for Happy Bridge or Bridge Plus that include a free lesson and then 14 deals with no fee. All team games, Swiss and KO, are stratified or bracketed; new and advancing players can compete at their same level. Gold points are awarded at almost every event that has at least two sessions.

No pre-registration is required and partners are readily available. There are registration gifts, table prizes, free parties and receptions, celebrity speakers, entertainment and a hospitality room with food and drink.

This is an exciting opportunity for local players that comes only once in a decade. Bridge players from all over the world will be here. It's a thrill you will never forget. Vendors will display every kind of bridge equipment, books, and accessories that you can imagine.

Most events are scheduled for 10 am and 3 pm for the convenience of commuters. There are some 1:00 pm and 7:30 pm Regional events; every night there will be the delightfully fun 11:30 pm games. The schedule has been specifically timed so that local players will not be travelling during high traffic times and can play a full schedule and still be home well before dark. Atlantans are encouraged to carpool and to take advantage of nearby parking costing only \$5 per day. MARTA runs every 10 minutes to the adjacent Peachtree Center Station for \$2.50 per trip. The Peachtree Center Mall, which is between the hotel and the MARTA train, houses 6 full-scale restaurants and 14 Food Court vendors. It's convenient for an inexpensive meal.

TRY THIS HAND...

Second Hand High!

South Deals ♠ 5 3
Both Vul ♥ A J 10 5 2
♦ 6 3 2
♣ 8 7 6

♠ 10 7 4 ♠ Q 9 8 6
♥ Q 8 7 ♥ K 9 3
♦ Q J 10 7 ♦ 9 8 5

This auction should be repeated at most every table.

Declarer wins the opening lead, tables the ♥ 4 and finesses the jack, losing to the ♥ Q. She holds up on the diamond return and wins the diamond continuation. Another

heart finesse yields at least nine tricks -- two spades, four hearts, two diamonds and a club.

Do you see how the contract can be beat? West has to be thinking at trick two. The bidding tells him that Declarer has exactly two hearts. Surely partner has the ♥ K, or Declarer would have led it. West must play his queen to block the heart suit. (Doubters, be my guest; try to make more than one heart trick if West plays the ♥ Q.) Second hand high limits Declarer to eight tricks at best. West might even steal a trick if Declarer plays him for the ♥ KQx but that would just be a bonus.

Warning! This is not a license to jump up with your honors in second seat. "Second hand low" is a good guideline, most of the time. You only want to play second hand high when you have a good reason. Here you have a good reason!

Please don't write to tell me that North/South can make 4♥, maybe even five. Would you and your partner be there?
